### P&C MEETING


Tonight the P&C will meet at 7pm in the school staffroom. I am looking forward to participating in tonight's meeting.







### 2021 School Dates

The Department of Education announced a change to Staff Development Days for 2021 and beyond. Commencing at the start of 2021, the changes include:

an increase from one to two SDDs at the commencement of Term 1

a decrease from two to one SDDs at the end of Term 4.

The School Development Days are scheduled for the following dates:

27 and 28 January, students return 29 January 2021.

The two SDDs at the start of Term 1 are mandated and cannot be rescheduled. Principals may continue to vary SDDs that fall at the beginning of Terms 2 and 3, and at the end of Term 4. There will be no changes to:

Friday 29th January – Students in Year 1-6 return


